

This straightforward, entertaining, sometimes nostalgic, and sometimes sad account of the Montreal Expos in their final season and of the events leading up to their departure is also a pocket history of the 33-year run of the franchise in Canada. The Expos were the first Major League Baseball team to relocate since the Washington Senators moved to Texas in 1997.
